




CHAMPAGNE

Dom Perignon 2002 £165

Containing more Chardonnay than Pinot Noir, the wine has real elegance and finesse, with great length. This really is a stunning wine, with an amazingly silky smooth mouth feel, well integrated fine bubbles and a wonderfully long finish. 2002 is a much more expressive wine than previous vintages, with characteristics and flavour not seen since the legendary 1996.

Louis Roederer Cristal 2004 £195

Louis Roederer was founded in 1776 and has been owned by the Rouzaud family since 1819, which makes it one of the few major Champagne houses to be family owned. Only Pinot Noir and Chardonnay grapes from the House's 10 most celebrated crus are used in the production of this legendary cuvee. This is a Champagne at its finest.




WHITE BURGUNDY

Chassagne Montrachet 1er Cru Les Vergers Jean Marc Pillot 2004 £95

From one of the top ranking domaines, this Chassagne has pure richness and depth with a long, intense finish.

Puligny Montrachet 1er Cru La Garenne Jean Marc Boillot 2008 £120

Classic Puligny with fresh yet intense Chardonnay fruit flavours with crisp mineral undertones and delicate oak.



RED BORDEAUX

Chateau Grand Mayne 1996 £95

Domaine Grand Mayne, includes just 21 hectares, with 17 in the great classified growth category, Jean Pierre and Marie Françoise Nony have managed the estate from 1977. Since the death of her husband Jean Pierre, Marie-Françoise Nony continues to manage surrounded by a competent team and her two sons Jean Antoine and Damien. Classic, mature right bank Bordeaux from a top vintage and one of the best properties in St Emilion.

Clos du Marquis 1998 £105

The second wine of the great Chateau Leoville Las Cases in the St Julien commune of Bordeaux - this wine is fabulously well balanced with flavours of over ripe blackberries and raspberries with leather over tones and well integrated tannins.

Chateau Talbot 2000 £130

The 2000 vintage of Chateau Talbot is a spectacular example of Bordeaux at its best. It produced a wine that is firm, rich and fruit driven alongside fresh hints of eucalyptus, pine and roasted nuts.

Chateau La Conseillante 2001 £155

La Conseillante is without doubt a leading estate in Pomerol and its vineyards lie on the very boundary between Pomerol and St Emilion. Nearby neighbours include Chateau Cheval Blanc in St Emilion, and Pomerol thoroughbreds such as Vieux Chateau Certan and Petrus. This 2001 exhibits ripe aromas of plum and raspberry fruit balanced beautifully with new oak.

Chateau Cos d'Estournel 1995 £175

Cos d'Estournel is now considered as the best of Saint-Estèphe and the 1995 vintage was no exception. Receiving 95 points from Robert Parker, it has extraordinary intensity with layers of delicious fruit, spice and new oak.

Chateau Leoville Barton 1990 £190

This is a monster of a wine! An exceptional vintage - robust and powerful with flavours of forest fruit, cedar, vanilla and superbly integrated tannins.
